The Lecturers

Pinn Siraprasiri graduated from the University of Oxford (St. Antony's College), UK and is a lecturer of International Relations at Thammasat University. Her research areas include regional integration and international security.

Wilaiwan Kanitthanun received her Ph.D. in Linguistics at the University of Michigan. She has written numerous articles and books about Thai language, its relationship with other languages and its use in Thai culture. Her recent publications include: *Language of the News Media in Thailand*. *International Journal of the Sociology of Language*. Volume 2007, Issue 186, and a book chapter in Diller et al. (eds, 2008): *The Tai-Kadai Languages*, Routledge.

Chulacheeb Chinwanno, Ph.D. (Stanford) is former Vice-Rector for International Affairs at Thammasat University. He is the coordinator of the university cooperation with JKU. His most recent publications include "Sixty Year of Diplomatic Relations Between Thailand and India: From Different Perception to Mutual Benefit" (2008) in *Corrine Phuankasem (ed.) Thailand and India Relations: Partnership for Peace and Prosperity*, Bangkok: Thammasat University Printing House, and "Thailand's Strategic Perception of Cross-Strait Relations," (2006) in Ho Khai Leong and Hou Kok Chung (ed.) *Ensuring Interests: Dynamics of China-Taiwan Relations and Southeast Asia*, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia: University of Malaya.

Kitti Prasirtsuk Ph.D. (Berkeley) is a renowned expert on ASEAN and especially the Association's relations towards Japan.

Dr. Michael Nelson is an expert on Thai politics and local elections, currently based at Thammasat University. His numerous publications includes "Institutional Incentives and Informal Local Political Groups (Phuak) in Thailand: Comments on Allen Hicken and Paul Chambers", (2007) *Journal of East Asian Studies* 7: 125–47

Wariya Chinwanno Ph.D (Hawaii) teaches Thai History, culture and ethics both at Thammasat University and Mahidol University. For the summer school program she will give an account of Thai history from ancient times to the establishment of Thai kingdoms of Sukhothai in 14th century, Ayuthaya in 15-17th century and Rattanakosin (Bangkok) Period in 19th Century.

Max Grömping is since this year a lecturer on conflict management at the Faculty of Political Science, Thammasat University. He is a graduate of the Free University of Berlin.

Dr. Gustav Gressel is the Austrian Commercial Counselor, attached to the Austrian embassy in Bangkok. He will hold a guest lecture, prepared for the summer program.

Tavida Kamolvej Ph.D. (University of Pittsburgh, USA) will give a lecture on the integration of intergovernmental coordination and information management in disaster control.
